

2023 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

SUPPORT

Engaged 340 volunteers who contributed 670 hours of work picking up litter, weeding and mulching garden beds, grubbing out blackberry and other invasive plants, and planting new native trees and shrubs

Hosted 6 free and successful events centered on education and art including an introduction to the iNaturalist app; intro to birding; nature writing workshop; history walk; salmon sleuthing walk; and painting in the park instruction

1000+ people attended Signature Events, including Polar Plunge, Walk n Wag, and Camp S'more.

80% of Camp S'more participants were first-time campers!

36 contest entries for the Recycle Right campaign helped promote a pilot recycling program at Sunset Beach, encouraging and reminding visitors to recycle.



Summer Litter Pickup

ENHANCE

1000+ gallons of litter removed during summer months in partnership with Kids Coming Together and the Lake Sammamish Urban Wildlife Refuge Partnership

169 native trees and shrubs planted, including 8 replacement shade trees throughout the Sunset Beach picnic area

Restored a 1.5-acre site along Tibbetts Creek, completing this corridor's habitat restoration

Supported Trail design work for accessible trail improvements that will create a new loop throughout the park using the funding we secured for our Comprehensive Trails Plan




Replacement Shade Trees


